



# Create the Question

Throughout the course you will spend much of your time answering exam style questions. Today, the tables have turned and it is over to you to **create an extended question** and **write the mark scheme**.



1. Create a question for one of the following topics:
  - **Respiratory System**
  - **Skill Acquisition**
  - **Training Methods**
2. Write out the mark scheme
3. Write out your question on a separate piece of paper and swap questions with your partner so you can attempt each other's questions
4. Mark your partner's answer and provide feedback.

Whilst composing your question and mark scheme you should consider:

- Does your question make sense?
- Is it obvious what is expected from an answer to your question?
- Which topics are relevant to your question
- Are the too few or too many elements to cover within a comprehensive answer to your question?
- Does your question only require knowledge which is in the specification?
- Does your mark scheme cover all elements of the question?
- If applicable, does your mark scheme contain some sporting examples?
- Is your mark scheme organised into assessment objectives?

**Remember, the marks should be distributed across Assessment Objectives as follows:**

**8 Marks:**  
**A01 = 2 Marks**  
**A02 = 3 Marks**  
**A03 = 3 Marks**

**15 Marks:**  
**A01 = 4 Marks**  
**A02 = 5 Marks**  
**A03 = 6 Marks**
